A Little About Our Caller

Thought you'd like to know, so we asked!



How long have you been dancing? I started dancing 54 years ago.

How long have you been calling? I started calling 45 years ago. My dad's brother was a caller (Ray Hogemark) and my cousin (Ray's daughter) is married to Gene Sondeno who was also a caller. Gene is the person who encouraged me to

try calling and helped mentor me when I first started. Bart Bartlette, a caller from Livingston, also gave me good advice when I first started calling.

Clubs for which you've been the caller? Big Sky Stompers, Big Sky; Hilltop Hoedowners MSU College Club; Half Pairs, Billings; Challengers, Billings; Country Cutups, Columbus; Checkerboard Squares, Billings.

Didn't you also do some dude ranch calling? Yes, during the summers for 37 years. I called every week from mid June until the end of August for the guests and staff at the 9 Quarter Circle Guest Ranch south of Big Sky. I also called at several other guest ranches usually just once or twice. I have called at wedding receptions and rehearsals. All of these events are an introduction to square dancing, similar to the first night of beginners lessons.

How about "real life"... teaching, coaching, your family? As a teacher and coach, I always tried to be positive with the students and enthusiastic when presenting lessons. My hope was always to have a very positive impact on all of my students. I am very thankful for my parents. They instilled a strong work ethic, responsibility and dedication. I am super proud of our daughters. They are both hard working career women who balance family with work and play. My wife and I met at square dance class at MSU Bozeman. I was the caller and she was a student in the class. My wife is awesome, she keeps me grounded while pushing me to try new experiences.

What do you like about calling? I really enjoy the mental challenge of calling. Planning different ways to teach and present calls so that the dancers can have success is something that I spend a lot of time thinking about. I also enjoy finding different ways to combine calls and ways to resolve squares.

What would you like the beginners to know about square dancing? What advice would you like to give them right from the start? Square Dancing is a participation activity, so don't be bashful, get out on the floor and dance! The biggest key to successful dancing is being a good listener. Have fun and don't be afraid to laugh and giggle.



USDA Insurance

When the Yellowstone Square Dance Council met on September 18, an important item of discussion was the requirements of the USDA (United Square Dancers of America) insurance program. This is a secondary insurance policy covering a dancer wherever he or she dances. Payments are due yearly by December 1 and are included in your \$10 annual YSDC dues. Beginners are covered through the end of their first season of lessons. In other words, if you began lessons in October of 2024, you were covered until the end of the lessons in April, 2024 but are now dancing uninsured until the new insurance period begins. To remedy this, we're asking the members of the "class of '25" to pay \$6 to cover them through December. If you'd like to simplify matters, you can pay \$16 now to cover insurance for the rest of this year plus 2026 dues.
